The February 5, 2022, meeting was called to order at 1:10 pm by President, Mark Loewen

- Treasury Report: Julie Loewen Treasurer: Reports the Chapter continues to have sufficient funds through the current year of 2022.
- <u>Minutes:</u> A motion to approve the minutes as written for the December 4, 2021, meeting was made by Mark Wiebens and seconded by Greg Wood. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### **OLD Business**:

- **December 11, 2021: Toy Run Nevada City: Tracy Stahlman report:** Report and photos attached to this newsletter. If you haven't been on the Nevada County Toy Run this is a must ride each year.

- Fort Sutter Dixon 2022 National Meet: Mark Loewen reports the Dixon National Motorcycle Show & Swap meet continues to progress and will be held. John Markley brought flyers for meeting attendees to take and promote the event. He stated that he has confirmed that both food vendors have been confirmed. 



First photo is the bike brought to me pre-covid. It was a literal mess. The bike was bought in '68 by his father new off the dealership floor and his son wanted to keep as much of the original parts his father put on the bike. It sat for many years after his father started on it. His goal was to finish his father's period Rat Rod bike so he could run to the store and back from time to time and have some fun while doing It.

I mounted the 2" over front end and 21" front tire from Lowbrow Customs-I have to say this, Todd is the man to talk to about these types of builds!

The wiring on the bike was totally fried. I installed Boyer system, solid state regulator, new dual coil and leads, complete new wiring and switches, headlight and LED taillight and plate frame, replaced primary and gearbox drive sprocket seals, de-coked the top end, new premium Amal carbs w/coated slides, custom 1" bars risers and bars, new controls and twistgrip, modified the oil tank with a return line running from the primary vent tube so if the oil in the engine wet-sumpted, it was returned back into the oil tank and added a vent so the primary vent pressure would not blow out the seals in the engine.

Customized the rear bolt-on frame section to mount the solo seat, replaced the rear braking components with NOS new parts, used a pre-unit rear brake lever parts for rear braking and the rear fender and tank were powder coated. He plans to have the rear wheel powder coated and replaced with stainless spokes and nipples to match the front wheel and a set of new pipes. I suggested some fishtails at the rear of the pipes for a period look and a great British sound!

Honestly, I've never been much for working on custom "choppers" and preferred working on stock British bikes over the years, but my first Triumph was a 68 Bonneville, and he was referred by a longtime friend so decided I would try to help him out. I have to say it turned out decent and it put a big smile on his face when he picked it up. I'm sure he will have some fun and memorable times riding this bike!

This bike has also given me a chance to learn and appreciate the work that goes into a bike build like this...and yes it was frustrating at times as well. I've even considered possibly building another bike like this for my son Alex for his 18th birthday...if I can find the right parts at the right price? Guess we will see what turns up in the future.

As promised, here's the details on AMCA Chapter discounts of the Element products.

- 1. 10% discount to individual purchases or 20% discount on sales of 10 units, or more. All sales are subject to shipping and CA sales tax. To get the 20% discount, shipment must be to one location.

- 5.) There is also a long bike Panhead chopper in the mix
- 6.) Also, a '77 Coney Island style Barge project that I've been collecting NOS chrome trim rail for almost five years.
- 7.) I have a very early stages UL project being built from a bottom end I purchased out of Lenny's stuff and an original offset springer that I have.
- 8.) Recently purchased a complete 1954 FLE Panhead that I'm finishing and riding as is, since it has come character and soul just as she sits.

That's a tough question, my collection is growing so I'm less about volume, more about interesting rides. If I had to quantify it, older Harleys are what I really like and what I am tooled up to work on.






